The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Rick Rieder, who noted that the meeting had been duly publicized, as required by law, in the Star Ledger and El Coqui with updated teleconference information posted on the North Star Academy website.

It having been moved and duly seconded, the trustees voted unanimously to approve the minutes from the March 15, 2021 board meeting.

Mr. Diamon began by giving an Education Program Update on the current status of North Star Academy Middle School Community Building. Mr. Bambrick-Santoyo continued with an Education Program Update by presenting on NSA's Social Emotional Learning Approach.
